


these challenges strengthen us and help us to be the disciples God has called us to be.





People watching by far is one of my most favorite things in this world to do. I love to see the mannerisms of people, how they talk, walk and dress. Now that I am sadly no longer in the thick of parenting, I find it fascinating to watch how others parent. Disney World is known as one of the most magical places in the world. Kids of all ages, young and old travel from near and far to capture a little bit of the Disney Magic. That being said, there's just something about parenting in Disney World.... It brings out the best or more often than not the worst in parents.

We've all seen that kid in the middle of the theme park have a complete and utter melt down. It's hot, they are tired, the kid is thirsty or hungry. Whatever the reason, the kid has shut down. Meanwhile Cruella de Vil is coming in hot. The mom is yelling and completely losing her mind. At this point, no one that is watching is looking at the child. They are on the sidelines eating their freshly popped Disney popcorn while watching the parenting nightmare that is happening

right in front of their eyes. It's a sight to behold. Oh momma! Your kid doesn't know what to do with their big feelings. They can't quite express how they feel. While they don't have any words, you, losing your mind momma, have all the words, yet they aren't the best words and frankly how you are responding to your child is quite scary.

We all know this situation can happen anywhere and at anytime. Navigating your child's emotions, as well as our response, is sometimes difficult. Often times, after the incident has passed, parents more often than not think they could have handled that better. Most parents would love a guidebook in this area, well at least I did! Well you are in luck, there is one.... The Bible.

Our words have such a strong effect on our children. What we choose to say and how we say it matters. The Bible gives us more than enough direction when it comes how to speak to others, yet we somehow seem to have a problem in this area.

- "A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." Proverbs 15:1.
- "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen." Ephesians 4:29
- "Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person." Colossians 4:6

These are just some of the verses that speak on this matter. There are so many more. However, it is clear that God's plan regarding our speech is that we should be wise in how we use our tongue. Scripture also shows us that what comes out of our mouths, is what is in our hearts (Matthew 15:10-20). So does that mean we can't just fly off the handle and scream at our children and others like a crazy person to get our point across and get their attention? Unfortunately not.

I grew up in house that was full of blunt women. I know it's hard to imagine, but I am the least blunt of all the women. Lauren has always been such a quiet child, but in the last few years, blunt has become her new theme. She shocks me sometimes. I apparently birthed a blunt child as well. We've had to have the "think it, don't speak it" talk in our house quite a few times over the past few years. I'm all about honesty, but there are ways to get your words across and still not offend the masses. Personally, I still have to work on that daily.

It doesn't help dissolve the problem if your words are nice, but delivered in a harsh manner. It stirs the pot and increases anger. How we speak to people in any situation speaks volumes. What you speak to them carries such weight.

How we speak to our children becomes the voice in their head and also they replicate what they hear.

If I could give people, especially parents something to think about on this matter, and also to instill in your children it would be:

1. Pray before you speak. Ask God to guide your thoughts and your tongue. Ask Him for the appropriate words to speak to people, but also for words that will edify and encourage others.

- 2. Think before you speak. If you are in the heat of a moment, stop and take a few moments to think about what you are going to say. Think about if what you are about to say would please God. If it isn't, then you probably shouldn't say it. As children of God, we are to be quick to listen and slow to speak (James 1:19). As a parent, I've seen when my words just crush Lauren's spirit. I can't take them back. Remember parents, the words that you speak to your children carry weight. Instead of putting them down, encourage them. Even in a moment of correction, the words you use should be full of gentleness, tenderness and grace.
- 3. Apologize when you are wrong. Instead of being quick to speak, be quick to apologize when needed. When you go to bed each night, you want your conscience about your speech to be right between God and man.

Will how you respond to certain situations or how you speak to people change over night? Absolutely not, but if we train our heart and minds on things above and do everything we can to let our conversations be full of Christ, then our mindset will change and our children will learn one of the most important tools I feel is needed today, Christfilled and honoring communication.

IBELIEVE

Recently, we introduced the song "I Believe" by Phil Wickham. This song declares our hope in the ministry and message of Jesus Christ. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 15 of the truth he declared - that Christ died for our sins, He was buried, but then raised to life again.

When asked about the story behind this song, Phil Wickham said, "There are so many people in a state of crisis of their faith [asking] what is real? What do I believe?...There's so many obvious people looking for hope. In a crazy world that seems like it's shifting every week, they're looking for some solid rock to stand on, that's not shifting underneath their feet. And I believe I've found it - with all my heart - in the person of Jesus."

The lyrics of "I Believe" echo the Apostles Creed & the Nicene Creed, declaring the essentials of our faith that form our theological foundation and understanding of God. The song itself becomes a modern creed of sorts, set to upbeat music as a "joy-bomb for people to get behind" as Phil Wickham has described it. The chorus calls us to praise the triune God - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - the One who has overcome. After declaring the truths that we believe, and raising our hearts to praise God, the song's bridge is a great exclamation point, quoting Romans 1:16: "No I'll never be ashamed of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. How could I ever walk away from the One who saved my life?" How, indeed!

In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul writes, "if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation is in vain, and so is your faith" (v. 14). Paul's words here are bold, but true. If Jesus wasn't raised from the dead, then he wasn't who he claimed to be, his teaching was in vain, and death won.

But Christ has been raised! This fact confirms His claims, His teaching, and His power over sin, death, and the grave. Jesus has won



the victory! We have confidence in the fact of Christ being risen because of eyewitness testimony and historical accounts. The hope we profess is definitely not futile. "It is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes" (Romans 1:16b). This work of Christ has borne fruit for the Kingdom of God for thousands of years - and is bringing dead people to life still today!

As Phil Wickham said, "In a world with so much confusion, it is like water to our souls when we sing the truth of what we believe. Because, for those of us who follow Jesus, we believe in life, healing, hope, and a God who loves us more than we can imagine. I hope this song blesses you today. I invite you to sing along, and preach to your own souls, the truth of who He is." While this music is certainly a celebration, it is simply a tool to communicate the truths we believe - the Truth (Jesus Christ) who we are to called to worship in every moment. I hope you declare these lyrics, as we proclaim the power of Christ for salvation in our church, in our homes, and in our community.




One of my seminary professors used to say to his class while teaching, "This is a drop from the altar." He was communicating to his students that what he was about to say was important and may well appear on the next test.
