- B. People were real

- 1. Pilate
- 2. Herod the Great
- 3. Caesar Augustus
- C. The struggles were real
- D. Jesus entered into this world with a divine purpose that intersects with our lives
- E. As Jesus enters our world, He intersects with your life as God wades into our mess to bring us back to Him
- F. The New Testament is the real story of our forgiveness, redemption, & salvation
- G. As God seeks to save the broken, lost, & dying like me & like you

IV. The overall theme of the Bible

- A. Humanity broke everything
- B. Humanity has been broken by:
 - 1. Hate

- C. God waded into our brokenness beginning as a child born in Bethlehem

V. The New Testament begins with Matthew's account of Jesus, the Messiah King

- A. He gives the genealogy of Jesus to declare He has the legal right to be King
 - 1. As a descendant of Abraham, Issac, Jacob, Judah, & David
- B. Matthew also wants us to know that in the genealogy of Jesus are misfits & mess ups
 - 1. That Jesus' family free is just like us
 - 2. He came to rescue us
- C. Some examples of misfits

1. Abraham got involved with his maid servant
2. Judah sold his brother into slavery & "other things"
3. Rahab was a Canaanite harlot
4. Ruth was a Moabite with a scandalous family tree
5. King David was an:
 - a. Adulterer
 - b. Murderer
 - c. Manipulator
6. Solomon was the child of Bathsheba

- D. Matthew is reminding us that everyone in the genealogy of Jesus is like us & we are like them
- E. Maybe Matthew is reminded that Jesus included/invited him who was a "major misfit"
- F. Matthew followed, believed, & came to Jesus who invited him to come to Him

VI. Mark's Gospel

- A. Jesus came to forgive us
- B. He healed us
- C. Brought the dead to life
- D. Demons flee in His Name

VII. Luke would say humanity veiled His glory
