

DONT **CHOOSE** CHURCH CHOOSE

Two years ago, I had a word that I used for children's ministry. I prayed over that word and I wanted it to be used for God. That word was "BOLD". I know I'm an outspoken person, but hard conversations and controversial topics aren't my thing. I don't normally want to rock the boat or be misunderstood about a subject, but I'm going to put myself out there and be bold. Today is not that day that I will stray from a hard conversation. Please hear me out and hear my heart. I don't want to offend anyone, but this has been on my heart for years, and I just didn't have the courage to boldly write this out. I've written and deleted this so many times as it is a sensitive subject for a lot to people, so I pray that you will keep an open mind and pray about how the Lord is leading you in training up your children who will be the church after we are gone.

Back a few years ago, a parent told their kid to tell me that they wouldn't be at church for three weeks because they had games on Sunday. The only response I could come up with at the time was "I hope it rains." I literally had no words. My heart hurt when I heard this. Listen, I don't want you to choose church. I want you to choose Jesus.

I look back at my childhood and see how my parents clung to their faith when their world was falling apart. You might not know, but I have a brother that is legally blind. He wasn't born blind. He was born three months premature and due to something with the oxygen his retinas became detached. My brother Shane has had over 7 eye surgeries, and during a lot of that time, my sister and I had to live with my grandparents.

During that same time, my dad played fast pitch softball. Not to brag or anything, but he was really good. So good, he tried out to play for the Cincinnati Reds. I was talking to my dad and asked him why he

turned all of that down. He told me that he was on a flight to a Fast Pitch Softball World Tournament and the Lord clearly told him that baseball had become a god to him. I can't remember my dad playing a game after that.

Through all of these life challenges with my brother and my dad playing baseball, church wasn't a priority for them. The Lord radically changed my dad. I can tell you that the dad I was born with, isn't the dad that I have today. I physically have the same dad, but spiritually, I do not. After that, I can't remember a Sunday we didn't go to church. When the doors were open, we were there. We were even there when the doors weren't open preparing or volunteering for something going on at church. My parents knew the secret to life wasn't church, but it was Jesus, and part of knowing Jesus was growing in our faith through corporate worship. That's what I want for my child, and that's what I want for yours as well.

I was recently reading an article and came upon the following quote and I had to sit and read that over again and just let it soak in. "The church is losing its young people because the parents never taught their children that it was important." - Carl Trueman

Our world is desperately wicked and doing every single thing possible to tear our families apart, and I believe the first place it is taking a stronghold at is in the area of church attendance. The first time you miss, it's hard and doesn't feel right, but the more you miss, the harder it is to come back.

The Bible gives clear examples of what happens when children are not taught consistently about Jesus.

Judges 2:10, "All that generation also were gathered to their fathers; and another generation rose up after them who did not know the Lord, nor even the work which He had done for Israel."

The first generation of people loved and served the one true God.

The second generation, not so much.

Jesus must be a priority for families. The Bible gives many scriptures about corporate worship. If we want to see the next generation follow Jesus, it needs to be modeled to our children.

Hebrews 10:25a states, "not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging another." The Bible clearly commands us to gather together as believers for corporate worship. I've heard the argument of having devotions before games, etc. That's great. I love that you are having a devotional before a game, and it's a great approach and it's better than nothing, but it shouldn't replace corporate worship at church. You are missing the best opportunity to teach your children that above all, Jesus should be the center of all things.

Children come into contact daily with people that think and believe differently from them and let me tell you, some of what I hear isn't exactly what you want your children to learn. When children go to church on a regular basis, they make relationships with people that share the same beliefs as they/their family do. They also have the opportunity to see adults that believe like mom and dad, serve Jesus and be their mentor, as well as seeing examples of multi generations serving God.

I had a set of parents in our church tell me that if something interfered with church, they weren't doing it. They clearly communicated to the teacher/coach that they wouldn't be available on Wednesdays and Sundays if they would miss church. I was over on the sidelines yelling, YES! They got it. They want to make sure their children have a firm foundation and know the rock on which they stand was founded on Jesus.

I've been in ministry long enough to see patterns develop in families and in their church attendance. Mom and dad come every other week and when their child is grown, the child only attends once every month or two. The next generation is a Christmas and Easter only family, better known in the church world as CEOs. What we do in moderation, our children do in excess. If we miss church a little bit, they will miss church a lot.

It's important for families to be in church regularly. I'm not telling you this because I want to see this place so packed with people, however I do love it. I want you to be in church because I want your children to know that there is a great, big, awesome and mighty God, who loves them. I want families to be in church because we need to be taught about Jesus too. Just like the 3R's are important to our children's success so we make school a priority, I want families to make church a priority because they can't make it without Jesus. I want our families to desperately want a relationship with Jesus that everything they think, say or do is pleasing to our heavenly Father and helps grow the kingdom. I want our children to know that when their world is crumbling, and it will, that they know that the church is their place where they can come for comfort and be surrounded by believers that will help encourage them and pray for them.

When I first started this article, I was telling my dad what I was writing about. He told me to be gentle in my approach. I've let him read the article to fact check and give thoughts. He said I said what I meant in a round about way, but that he thought I should just come right on out and state what I was trying to say. So to honor my dad, and the fact that Jesus radically changed him in this area when I was a young child, I will be bold because it was so important to him, and now as a parent, it is just as important to me. We, as parents set an example for our children and they watch what we say and do. They also see what is and what is not a priority for their parents. So parents, please choose wisely.

I know I said I don't want to choose church, but choose Jesus and I really mean that. However, I want you to be in church because you choose Jesus and because you want your children to follow in your footsteps. I want your children to see the value of going to church as much, if not more than you do, because this world needs Jesus now more than ever.



WHEN YOUR WORSHIP IS RIGHT, YOUR LIFE WILL BERIGHT.

Each year, many of us make New Years' Resolutions - noble goals we promise to actually keep this year, unlike last year... or the year before that. These resolutions are generally things we know we need to pay more attention to in our lives - losing weight, getting out of debt, finishing that project, etc. I want to encourage each of us to take stock of where we are spiritually and resolve to strengthen our reliance on God, grow in our understanding of His Word, and live as followers of Christ. These 'resolutions' may be the most important ones we make this year because our spiritual health impacts the rest of our lives.

In Matthew 6:33, Jesus says, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." When we focus our hearts, our thoughts, and our lives on Christ first, He provides for us, and His righteousness sustains us. You see, a busy-centered heart is not going to lead to greater peace or less anxiety. It's only with a Christ-centered heart that everything else falls into place, not the other way around. Centering our hearts on Christ everyday begins first and foremost with worshipping Him. Louie Giglio has said, "When your worship is right, your life will be right." When our lives are focused on Christ first and foremost, seeking His heart and direction as our first priority, then our lives are oriented the best way - the right way.

Worship of our Savior is meant to be so much more than just singing songs.

It's an important piece, no doubt, and it's something Scripture calls us to do daily but it's only one piece. Worship is defined as ascribing worth to someone or something that holds significant value - in our case, God. Christian worship is a longing to experience the genuine presence of God. It's a desire to know Him, to interact with Him, and to experience the things we sing about to be true of God and of His involvement in our lives. It's a desire for relationship. Just as our connection with a spouse grows the closer we are in relationship with each other, when we walk closer in relationship with God, the deeper our worship of Him grows.

"Worship, as it is described so vividly in Scripture, was meant to be a dialogue, flowing from the outpouring of a relationship with God. Worship is more than one-way communication from us to God. It is a two-way communication between God and His people. We exalt God. He reveals His presence and changes our hearts. We pour out our hearts and remember His greatness...He meets our needs for intimacy and grace" (Joe Horness). When we see worship as a rich expression of a growing relationship with our Savior, we place the highest value on it. When our lives are oriented around Christ-centered worship first, we grow in a desire to see our world through God's eyes and begin to re-prioritize the things in our schedule. Sure, we still bring the kids to dance or sports, but we recognize those activities aren't the center of our lives, nor

is our identity wrapped up solely in those activities. Our identity and the center of our focus in life should be rooted in our relationship with Christ. Everything else falls into place from there. With God first, we want His will for our lives to take center stage, and everything else that is a distraction to fade away. As we worship Him, we make the choice to place His priorities as our first priority.

As we examine our hearts in worship, are we worshiping in spirit and in truth (John 4:24), or are we just going through the motions? The prophet Amos makes it clear that we can worship in a way that is not authentic, and that it actually burdens God's heart (Amos 5:21-23). Are we coming to church to join a community of believers in singing, fellowship, learning, and serving? Or are we coming to church to just go through the motions, to let those on stage do our worship for us (as if that's somehow even possible)? Are we worshiping Him during the week, away from a church service? Do people see the "joy of our salvation" (Ps. 51:12) in the way we live and prioritize our schedules? In this new year, may we do as Dr. Chuck Kelley (former President of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary) has said, may we "choose uncomfortable obedience over comfortable disobedience every time."



I would like to express my gratitude for the Lord blessing me with the time I've been allowed to serve God's people here at Live Oak. In the last 3 1/2 years, God has led me through some of the greatest, and toughest times in ministry. Doing ministry in the town and church I grew up in has been rewarding and challenging. Had it not been for God's faithfulness and the refuge of this rock solid staff - made up of many people I claim as dear friends and brothers and sisters in Christ -I'm not sure I would have experienced all the amazing victories God has led me through.

This year our church has walked through some incredible and difficult change. God faithfully led us through disaffiliation from the UMC.
