YOU ARE ENOUGH

I don't just want my kids to be moral. I don't just want them to know all of the biblical rules for behavior. I don't just want them to go through my home with good grades, and no drug addiction. I want them to leave my home with a hunger and passion to know God personally and to be used by Him to accomplish great things for His kingdom.

"Raising your kids will be the hardest thing you ever do, and it will hurt more than anything you've ever done."


That was the words of my father-in-law when we had our first child in our twenties. We had only been married two years, were still figuring each other out, and had no idea what he meant. It didn't take long though to fully understand. Parenting is HARD.

There are so many books, YouTube videos, and podcasts on parenting that it can be overwhelming. Everyone seems to know the perfect formula for raising exceptional kids. But what you will quickly figure out is that there is no perfect formula. Parenting is fun, challenging, joyful and frustrating, all at the same time. And we often wish that someone would just tell us how to solve all of our parenting problems and help us navigate the tough situations and hard conversations. When gut-wrenching situations hit us hard, we can't quit or ball up in a corner and fall apart. We have to manage these challenges, even when we don't feel like it.

Sometimes biblical parenting goes against what the "experts" are telling us. The purpose of biblical parenting is to train children to know God, love God, and honor Him. This can't be achieved by behavioral training alone; it requires a transformation of the heart. So much of the information available to us about parenting focuses on behavior modification and not much is said about teaching children that God loves them even more than we do, that they have a purpose and that He has plans for them.

Things begin to change in a child's mind when they start to realize how important they are to God. That he formed them in the womb and put his thumbprint on them. In my job, I see a lot of broken kids. Kids whose identity is coming from their peers or their influencers. We talk a lot about how they were made by God, for God, and for a purpose. They have to be told over and over, because the world teaches them differently. The world teaches them they aren't smart enough, tall enough, pretty enough, strong enough, athletic enough, skinny enough, and so much more. The only way a child can break through the pressure to "be enough" is to teach them how much God loves them. Tell them every day. Tell them before they leave for school in the morning. Tell them before they go to a friend's house. Tell them before every competition. Tell them. Back it up with scripture. Get your Bible out and show them God' word about them.

One last thought... as a parent, do you believe these truths about yourself? As adults, we are greatly influenced by our culture and environment. Do you know and understand how much God loves you? That He has plans for you and made you in His image? Jeremiah 1:5 says "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." Parenting is a lifelong commitment and you have to be ready to play for the long haul. There isn't one experience, episode or conversation that gives you the answer, but over time, God will use you to shape the way your child sees Him and help your children understand the way God sees them. And because God loves you, God is FOR you. He will help you as you fulfill your responsibility of raising your children.



GOD BIBLE STUDY FOR WOMEN

Our Experiencing God Women's Bible Study meets on Mondays at 6:30 PM in the Chapel. This study will be led by Jan Tate.

This may be the most rewarding Bible study you have ever been involved in. Many people have been told about God and have read about God, but do not know Him personally.

This Deeper Life study will help you actually encounter and experience God and develop a personal relationship with Him. God wants to be your best friend. This study will help make that happen.



Worship songs talk often about the "joy of the Lord," or "rejoicing" in God's presence and His goodness. Depending on what translation of the Bible you prefer, there are roughly 200 instances of the word "joy" and another 200+ instances of the word "rejoice" throughout the Scriptures. So what is true joy? What does Biblical rejoicing look like?

In today's culture, we often use the terms "joy" and "happiness" interchangeably. But true joy - the joy the Scriptures speak of so often - is a deeper, richer source than just happiness itself. No circumstance or situation can take joy from us. If we see happiness as "surface level," then joy is the deep-rooted, foundation of life and unshakeable rejoicing within our souls.

Psalm 87 speaks of worshippers declaring to the Lord, "all my fountains are in You." These fountains are a well-spring of life, bursting forth from the deepest places of our souls. As worshipers, we can declare this line with the psalmist when our ultimate joy is rooted in the

never-ceasing well of Christ - our joy for His glory. Each of us will still experience seasons of pain and difficulty, or grief and loss - that is part of the nature of the human experience living in a fallen world - but deeper than each of those struggles is the joy of Christ's saving work in our lives, the "joy of His salvation," and the promise of God's faithfulness through every season.

One of the notable mentions of joy in the Scriptures is found in Psalm 51. Here, David is repenting of his sin for committing adultery with Bathsheba. In this psalm, David declares "create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and sustain me with a willing spirit" (Ps. 51:10-12). As David repents of his sin, he pleads for God's grace and compassion to wash him and make his life clean again. In this process, David specifically lists God restoring the joy of His salvation in his life. For David, and others throughout history, they recognized "the joy of the Lord

is their strength" (Neh. 8:10). David knew it is essential for God's saving work to produce the fruit of joy in a believer's life. As we reflect and respond on what the Lord has done to forgive us, to cleanse us from sin, and to restore our relationship with Him, we cannot help but respond with thankfulness, gratitude, joy, and ultimately, worship.

As our lives are centered around the joy of the Lord, we are called to serve Him and His church from the overflowing fountain of His work in our lives. Psalm 100:1-2 encourages us to "shout joyfully to the Lord all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness; come before Him with joyful singing." Gladness is not just an emotion. Gladness is a byproduct of our joy, the deep-rooted substance in our lives.

Is there joy in your worship? Regardless of your background, your perspective, or your preferences, does Christ's salvation produce joy in your life that overflows into worship? Does the atoning work of Christ to pay for your sins and renew your heart produce a heart that rejoices in His salvation? Do others see that joy within you, flowing out to shine His light into a dark and depressed world? If not, may you pray like David: "God, create in me a clean heart; restore in me the joy of Your salvation."

This month, we are introducing a new song into the life of the church called "House of the Lord" by Phil Wickham. This upbeat worship song is a great declaration of the joy that should be present in the lives of all believers. As Phil Wickham said, "The house of the Lord isn't something made by hands or by man. It's you and it's me who call ourselves believers in Jesus." As believers, we each have a calling and a commission to impact the world with the love - and the joy - of Jesus Christ. The world around us desperately needs to experience the life-transforming power of His love, and have their lives changed by the deep-rooted joy of Christ. Jesus himself prayed in John 17:13 "that they (we) may have the full measure of My joy within them." Jesus prayed for His joy to be bursting forth within us. He prayed that the deep-rooted source of our joy would be centered and grounded in the fullness of Christ's joy - enduring the cross, defeating the grave, and interceding on our behalf (Heb. 12:2).

May each of us be encouraged to take a stand for our faith and share the hope of Christ's joy within us. That is our calling and commission as believers. Let's share the joy of the Lord inside of us with those around us - in our schools, our jobs, our homes, and even our church. Let the house of the Lord sing praise!

The Baptist Denomination proposes that you grow a church through the Sunday School as people come together is Small Groups to study God's Word together. As a result, people feel connected to the life of the church and as people study God's Word and fellowship together, people's needs are discovered and ministered to. In addition, those that are not believers hear the Gospel proclaimed and have the opportunity to believe in Jesus and be saved.

I don't know that one of these church growth philosophies alone is adequate. What I do know is that the Acts 2 model of church growth is.

"42 All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.

43 A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. 44 And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. 45 They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in

need. 46 They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity— 47 all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved." Acts 2:42-47 (NLT)

v. 42c-Prayer

vv. 44-45-Ministry

v. 46-Worship

And as they did, they were filled with awe, joy and praise unto God. And as a result, God added to the church those who were being saved!




CONNECT CAMPS GATHERING


