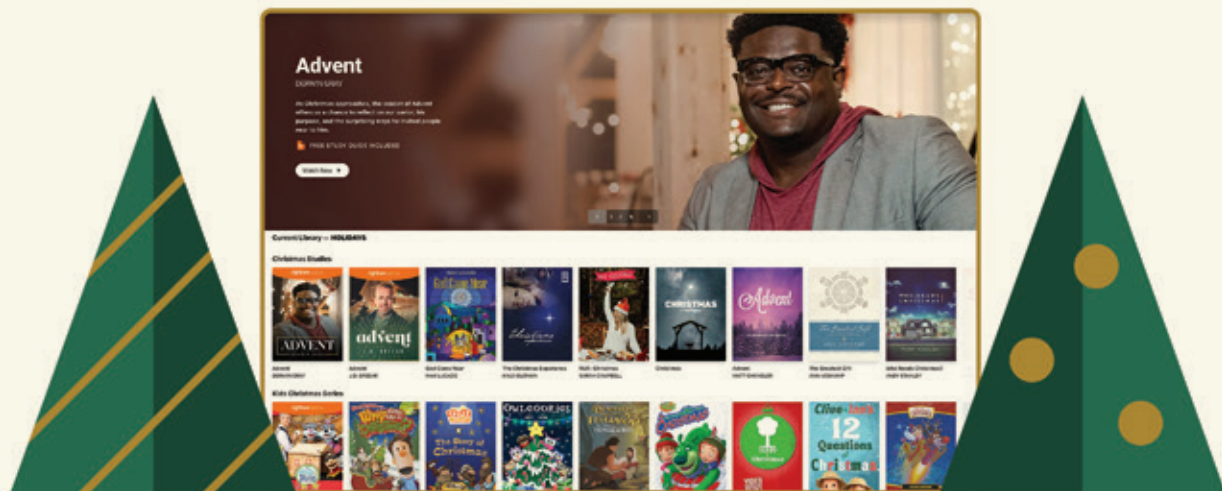

HOW DO I SPELL SUCCESS?

As many of you already know, and for those that don't, I will be retiring from the ministry and the church on January 1, 2023. As such, I have taken the time to reflect on my time as a pastor and have asked, "Have I been successful in what I have done? How do I spell success?"

To answer these questions, I talked with other pastors, some retired and some active, to hear their responses regarding success in the ministry. Most all indicated that success meant moving to a larger congregation because that is how one was promoted. But I also heard sadness as many expressed that in the pursuit of larger pulpits, they neglected their families.

Sometimes, when we get what we want, we discover that we don't want what we've got. Success isn't always all that it is cracked up to be. Unfortunately, the drive for success in worldly accomplishments bleeds over into the world of the church. And, I found that I got caught up in some of those unhelpful attitudes from time to time.

I don't like to admit it, but there were times when I was jealous of others – others whose ministry seemed more successful; higher attendance, more recognition, and so forth. Admittedly, I wanted that success. I wanted to feel that I had arrived, that I mattered and was making a difference.

Now, this is a skewed understanding of ministry and success. But that is the yardstick that many use. And, this thinking is tempting and alluring with the power to draw us in.

Here's the thing. If having a large congregation with a huge budget and huge worship attendance is the meaning of ministerial success, then I think we have to count Jesus Christ as a great failure.

Now understand, I believe that if He wanted to, Jesus could have built a great center of learning and worship, and thousands upon thousands would be drawn there. But He didn't do that. Jesus chose to go around the countryside, teaching to those who would listen. He never spent much time in one place. He didn't try to organize a large group of like-minded scholars. Instead, He found ordinary men, who worked for a living and who were somewhat short on formal education, and taught them what they needed to know. Also, Jesus didn't wear His credentials out on His sleeve to let everyone know how great He was.

This is not exactly what 21st century standards would define as successful. **SUCCESS IS FOUND IN FOLLOWING JESUS CHRIST, not in accumulating worldly honors, riches or fame.**

This brings me to where I am today. In Mark 9 we read the account of Jesus and the mount of transfiguration. (I encourage you to read it sometime.) As the Bible says, while there, Jesus was transformed before Peter, James and John. It was such an exciting event that Peter wanted to build booths and stay on the mountain top. But they never got around to building any structures because a voice from heaven spoke saying, "This is my Son...listen to Him."

Jesus brought them down off the mountain because there was much work that needed to be done – they had to come down to the valley to the people who needed to hear the gospel message.

The mountain top is a terrific experience. And, we all need times like that. But that is not where true success lies. Success is meeting people where real needs are.

In Luke 4, Jesus reminded us that He came for the oppressed, for the poor, and for the imprisoned. He came that the blind might have sight, that the lame might walk, that the deaf might hear, and that the mute might speak. He came because He knew that there were those whose spiritual lives were dry. He came to let people know that God loves them and cares for them. In other words, Jesus came as one to serve. And that is what He called me to do – to serve.

So, how do I spell success? By asking what is important to me. By looking at my life to see what flows from my service. By asking, "Am I willing to come off the mountain top and walk in the valley and serve those that truly matter to Jesus Christ?"

SUCCESS IS FOUND IN FOLLOWING JESUS CHRIST, NOT IN ACCUMULATING WORLDLY HONORS, RICHES OR FAME.

As I look back over the 16 years that I have spent here, as well as the 8 years in ministry before, I realize that I haven't always said the right things, or even done the right things. But I feel that I can say that I have never stopped loving Jesus nor His people here at Live Oak Church. I will miss being on staff. But know, that I will continue to be here, serving where the Lord leads.

God bless you all. And, thank you for all you have done for me.

I recently read that this generation is the most entertained and visually stimulated generation in history. Movies are full of amazing special effects. Video games, phones and apps keep young men and women constantly entertained. They are more connected now than ever in history. Yet despite all of their constant entertainment and connection, they are the loneliest and most depressed generation in history. As a church we have found that more entertainment is not the answer. We like to have fun and have activities with our students, but studies have revealed that what they seek is not more entertainment but truth. Students need to hear both the gospel message and why the Bible is true.

Luke 2:52 says that Jesus grew in wisdom and stature. In 1 Corinthians 11:1, the Apostle Paul said to imitate me as I imitate Christ. This is the focus of our student ministry here at Live Oak. Over the last two years we have witnessed our students grow in their knowledge and love of the Lord in amazing ways. Our student ministry emphasizes the use of apologetics. In 1 Peter 3:15, Peter instructs believers to always be ready to give a defense of what they believe. The word defense is the Greek word (apologia). It does not mean to apologize but to give a reasonable defense of why you believe what you believe. Through this focus we have seen an incredible response of students wanting to commit to Jesus and serve at the church. We have students weekly who confess a change of heart and attitude. This is the result of teaching students the true words of the scriptures.

CHRISTMAS IS ABOUT WORSHIP BEFORE ANYTHING ELSE

When it comes to the Christmas season, it's safe to say life gets busy. We go from store to store trying to find the right gifts for everyone on our list. We rush from party to party trying to see everyone we need to see (or maybe just to meet family/work obligations). We spend time with the family decorating the house, baking treats, and creating memories - all things that define the Christmas season for many of us.

The very first Christmas happened in obscurity though - without trees or decorations, in a small town, and likely in a cave where animals were kept (not quite as picturesque as the manger scenes we decorate our homes with). Almost no one around noticed what happened that night. People went about their busy lives, unaware a baby had just been born that would change history. Christmas is the time we celebrate that birth - the birth of Jesus Christ.

The celebration of the baby Jesus born in the manger at Christmas is forever linked to the work He came to accomplish - His death and resurrection. This is the ultimate sacrifice that brought salvation and life to a world overwhelmed by darkness. In Matthew 2 and Luke 2, when the Magi and the shepherds visit the newborn Jesus, it's amazing to see what happens in those moments: they worship. "They saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped Him" (Matthew 2:11). For them, the birth of the baby who would bring redemption to the world is good news worth celebrating. For them, Christmas is about worship before anything else. They fall on their knees in worship, praising the wisdom of God who comes to us in the form of a baby.

Christmas music provides a great opportunity to worship by lifting our voices through singing, thanking God for sending His Son to be the shining light for our redemption. When we focus on the words we sing (not just the melodies), we dig deeper into what those words mean. These texts are filled with great lyrics of celebration that lead us to worship. "Glory to the newborn King...God and sinners reconciled" (Hark! the Herald Angels Sing). "God sent us salvation that blessed Christmas morn" (Go Tell It on the Mountain). "Remember Christ our Savior was born on Christmas Day to save us all from Satan's power when we were gone astray" (God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen).

So this Christmas season, let us remember: Christ our Savior was born! It's a moment in time worth celebrating. May we pause from the busyness to remember and to celebrate the birth of God's Son, who died on the cross for our sin, and who rose from the dead to defeat sin, death, and the grave. This Christmas, let us "worship Christ the newborn King!" (Angels from the Realms of Glory). When Christians focus on the real celebration of Christmas, an amazing thing happens: the world sees people who look differently, worshiping Christ as their first priority, and hearts are drawn to a saving knowledge of Him. Christmas is not about the presents, decorations, food, or traditions. It is all about celebrating and sharing the Good News of the birth of the Savior of the world, God Incarnate. 🍀



ARE YOUR KIDS WATCHING YOU?

You bet they are...

We hear a lot about teaching our children to have “Godly behavior” or to be “Christ-like” in their words and actions. I agree that it is important to teach our children this behavior, but, I think, it is even more important to show them this behavior, modeling Godly behavior.

I’ll never forget that Sunday morning when I brought my granddaughter with me to “big” church, and during worship, she raised her hands in praise. She was four. Did she know what she was doing or why she was doing it? No, but she was watching me and figured it must be the thing to do. Children do what we do.

Your kids are watching you live life, the good, bad, and ugly. They are watching how you handle it when things are stupid crazy in the morning, you’re late, your kid only has on one shoe and two different socks, and you can’t find your keys. They are watching when you and your spouse have an argument but then make up. They

see you when you help the elderly lady with her groceries at the store. And they notice when you are sad and broken and reach out to God for comfort. They also see you grab your Bible when you’re looking for guidance.

Proverbs 22:6 says “Train up a child in the way he should go, and he will not depart from it.” One definition of the word train is to “teach a particular skill or type of behavior through practice and instruction over a period of time. That’s the definition we usually think of when we are talking about behavior. But I also like this one: “to direct growth usually by bending and pruning.” Modeling Christian behavior may take a bit of bending and pruning; both from us as parents and our kids as well.

I get it, parenting isn’t always easy and it means we have to be intentional every single day. It’s really hard to model appropriate behavior for your kids all the time, and no one is expecting you to be perfect. Life is

messy and every day brings its challenges, but this gives us opportunities to live a life worth copying. Think about what you want your kids to learn from you and try to model that in your own life. There will be times, many times, when you make mistakes or don’t do things exactly as you had planned. But, that is okay. When that happens, take the opportunity to talk to your kids about where you slipped up and how you hope to be different next time. Kids learn important lessons from you when they see you correct mistakes.

We are not perfect. None of us are. We all fall short and we all, at times, behave in ways that we aren’t happy about. Surround yourself with friends who love the Lord. Attend church and Bible Study. Study your Bible and pay attention to what you are watching and listening to. By modeling Godly behavior, we can help our children through their formative years and mold them into men and women of God, well-equipped to navigate life. 🌱

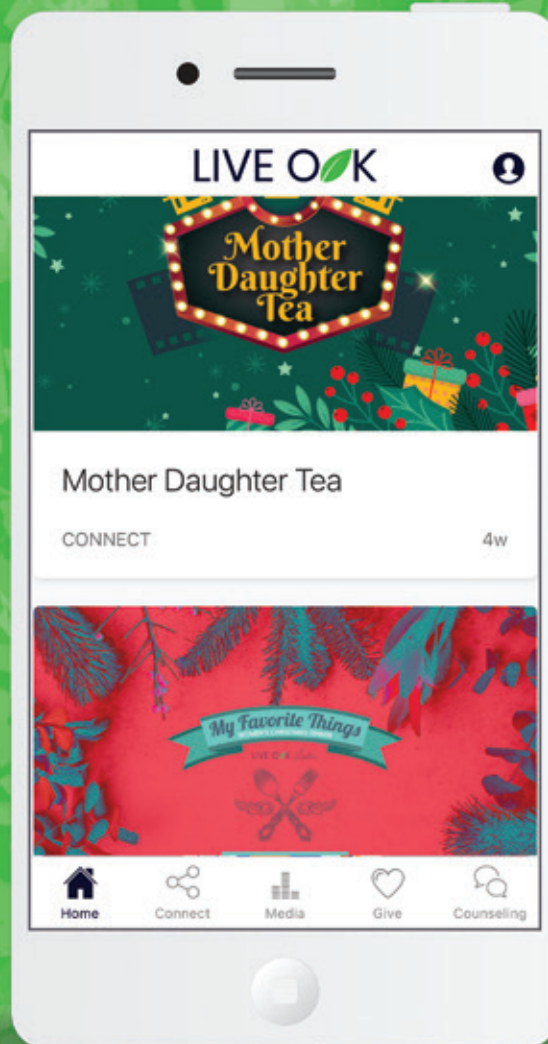

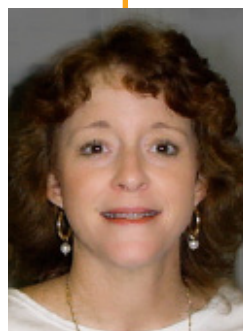
