



ometimes, it's hard believe we are beginning a new year. Looking back on 2023, this was our first year as an independent church, and seeing how God blessed us in 2023 was so exciting. In 2023, we saw a major increase in attendance as so many new faces and families joined us. We saw many familiar faces returning after the Covid lockdowns and concerns. We also saw many ministries start, and some old ones get a new opportunity to grow and thrive.

In 2024, we look forward to seeing what God will do through some of the ministries He is raising up. The small groups, student ministries, and children's ministries are expanding, which is a wonderful sign of a healthy and growing church. Our weekday ministries and special ministries

The term "worship" is unfortunately misunderstood in many circles, or has extra baggage attached to it that clouds its simplicity. The word worship simply means, "ascribing worth to someone or something." In the case of Christian worship, God's people are created to worship Him - every single one of us. Paul writes that we are to "offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God - this is your true and proper worship" (Rom. 12:1). No conditions are built into this passage because we've been created to worship our Creator and our Savior in all seasons and all places.

When we come before the Lord in worship, we draw closer to Him, and He meets us there. We pray with eagerness, sing with hearts abandoned, and study God's Word with intentionality. As we recognize our need for God, there is a deep desire to know God better, and to understand the way He relates with His people. Theology (the study of God) isn't just reserved for pastors or seminary students. Theology is intended for all of God's people. Our theology leads us into deeper doxology - the ways in which we praise God. As our hearts and minds are informed and led by the Word of God, our theology informs our doxology, our doxology leads to a greater emphasis on theology, and on it grows.

Matt Boswell (a worship pastor in TX) has said, "the rhythm of worship is revelation and response: our beliefs about God's revelation dictate our response." Our study of God both informs why we worship, and shapes how we engage in worship. The closer we draw to God in prayer, in study, and in relationship, the more we long to know Him further.

Throughout Scripture, we see hundreds of calls and commands to "sing to the Lord." Throughout Scripture and in history, the people of God have met with each other and with God, singing songs of worship and praise. There is both a vertical (to God) and horizontal (to each other) nature to singing, and a filling of the Holy Spirit as we sing (Eph. 5:18-20). When we gather together as the body of Christ for corporate worship, the only appropriate type of singing is that which glorifies God. We sing to the Lord and for His glory. As we do this, believers are edified (built up), and reminded of our salvation. This propels us to share the hope within us and leads others to saving knowledge in Christ.

In light of this, we remember that who we are singing to (God) and what we are singing about (the Gospel) will always be more important than the how. Styles, methods, and cultures change, but the foundation of Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Heb. 13:8). "The message must never change, but the methods and means must be ever-changing to bring an ever-changing generation to the knowledge of the never-changing truth of Jesus" (John Bisagno, former pastor of FBC Houston).





There are some big changes taking place within our facilities.

Beginning in January, our nursery hallway will now only have children that are in the infant, one and two year old classes.

Our preschool, three and four year old classes will now be held in the children's church area on Sundays.

Our current kids in kindergarten

through third grade will now meet in the FLC (gym) on Sundays at 9:30 and 11. (Wednesdays will still take place in the children's church area.)

There will be new places to check your children in, and new safety measures will be put in place.

Please make sure you read your e-mails to know what all is happening in the nursery, preschool and children's ministry in the days and weeks to come.

Dr. Robert McGee points out that experiences in our life impact how we view God. He goes on to say that our view of God impacts how we experience God.

How do you view God? Some view Him as a grandpa in the sky asking Him for what they want. Others view God as a policeman watching to correct them. Still others view God as having too much to do to be involved in the details of their life.

My former pastor had hopes of serving his country in the Air Force. That's how he viewed his future. The direction of his life changed when God called him into the ministry. As a result, he experienced God as his Commander-In-Chief. In his Daily Quiet Time, he reported to duty to receive his orders for the day to serve the Kingdom of God.

David, the son of Jesse, grew up to be king over all of Israel. As a boy he had a lot of experience as a shepherd. He understood how dependent the sheep were on the shepherd to guide them, to provide for them and to protect them. He knew that the shepherd's presence was essential for the well-being of the sheep.

From those experiences in his life as a shepherd, viewing his lambs as in need of his care, David declares in the 23rd Psalm, "The Lord is my Shepherd." In his reign as king, and throughout his life, David

experienced God as His Shepherd. David looked to God for comfort, protection and provision. He sought His presence. He communed with God and looked to Him for guidance. He saw himself as dependent upon the Lord, his Shepherd.

I came up in a home where my father was often absent and unavailable. He had several stays in V.A. Hospitals and spent the last 15 years of his life in a nursing home. As a result, I didn't have the privilege of experiencing a father's oversight, guidance and care. Since I became a Christian some 47 years ago, I have approached God as my Heavenly Father. He is always present with me. He doesn't get disabled. He will never leave me or forsake me. He has provided me with constant guidance and care.

So, what's your view...of God? For how you view Him impacts how you experience God. Dr. McGee points out that there may come a time in our life when we need to renew our view of God.

Something to consider as you ponder your view of God...how you will experience God. In 2 Corinthians 6:18 we find these words, "I will be your Father, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

So, what will be your view...of God?.
