I. The laws that maintain life

- A. The laws of physics
 - 1. The law of gravity
 - 2. The law of entropy
 - 3. Newton's law of motion
- B. These laws put in place so that life can exist
- C. Laws keep systems in place

II. The laws or principles of marriage

- A. God put into place (Genesis 2:22-25)
- B. To be followed and understood
- C. We suffer when we violate these principles

III. The four primary principles

- A. The law of priority
 - 1. Leaving and cleaving
 - 2. After marriage we must reprioritize
 - 3. (After Jesus) your spouse becomes first
 - 4. The Bible is intolerant of rivalry (something taking the place of established truth)
 - 5. Most couples have a higher satisfaction in the early stages of marriage
 - 6. Over time "other things" scream to be priority
 - 7. Marriage only works when it is in first place
 - 8. How to establish the right priorities
 - a. Actions more important than words
 - b. Sacrifice: Some things must go or be reduced
 - c. Time: Commodity of any relationship
 - 1) Beware of technology
 - 2) A good servant, but a terrible master
 - 3) It can create disconnection
 - d. Energy: This is a marathon not a sprint
 - e. Attitude: To be willing to serve the other
 - 1) Beware of trying to "prove yourself"
 - 2) Don't sacrifice your family on the altar of success

- 9. A blended family is to be built around the marriage not the children
 - 1. Beware of the popularity contest
 - 2. Build life around marriage, otherwise you become divided
 - 3. Be coaches, not performers
- 10. Be willing to make changes necessary for your marriage
- B. The principle of pursuit
 - 1. Is to be ongoing
 - 2. (Our problem) we work until we get what we want, then we stop
- C. Some myths we believe that negatively impact marriage
 - 1. If I marry the right person then our emotions will come naturally, effortlessly
 - 2. Myth 2: something is wrong if I have to work at this
 - 3. Myth 3: I am looking for my soul mate
- D. What "real soul mates" look like
 - 1. Two people who recognize they are messed up
 - 2. Who give each lots of grace
 - 3. Who lets the love of God flow through them
 - 4. Who work at being good at marriage (serving, loving, giving)
 - 5. Who overcome life's problems (together)
 - 6. Who forgive deeply and often
 - 7. Who come out as best friends
 - 8. Who look beyond faults and meet needs
 - 9. Love is a choice, a matter of the will
 - 10. Marriages that succeed work at getting better every year
- E. The worst marriages have these traits
 - 1. No forgiveness
 - 2. No one tries to improve
 - 3. Put expectations on the other one, no one can fulfill
 - 4. Spend their life punishing or parenting their spouse
 - 5. Feels it's all about them
 - 6. Doesn't believe you can get love back
 - 7. Stays on the crazy cycle
- F. Recognize that marriage follows the manna principle
 - 1. Each day is a new day
 - 2. The point system works only for the day
 - 3. All points "evaporate" at midnight
 - 4. You can't store up "points"
 - 5. Love must be renewed every day, like eating, sleeping

- G. The law of possession
 - 1. Marriage is about openness
 - 2. Marriage is about sharing
 - 3. Anything withheld creates
 - a. Division
 - b. Jealousy
 - c. Animosity
 - 4. Messiah is to be the focus
 - 5. Dominate and control creates dysfunction and destruction
 - 6. Marriage is difficult for selfish people
 - 7. Make decisions with your spouse's knowledge and blessing
- H. The principle of purity
 - 1. Take responsibility for actions
 - 2. Don't let things come between you and your spouse
 - a. Other people
 - b. Career
 - c. Hobbies
 - d. Attitudes
 - e. Secrets
