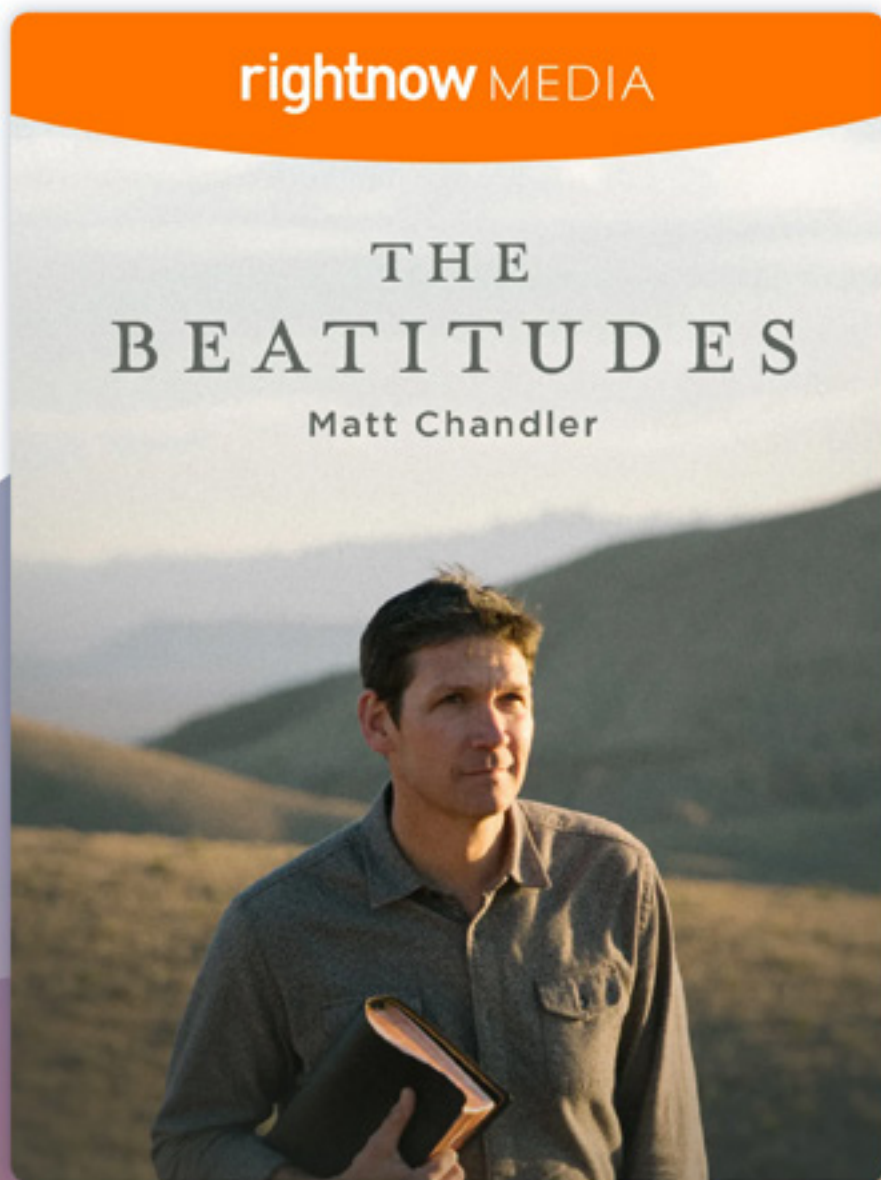

OUR KIDS CAN DO BIG THINGS

On a normal Wednesday night a few years back, we were serving dinner to the children. I was so busy throwing out slices of pizza to the children that I didn't have time to stop and help a child open up their drink when they asked. This child was in kindergarten at the time and I knew for sure they could do it, since I knew other children could open theirs around 3 years old. I told them they could open their own drink. A little while later, when all the children had gotten their dinner, the same child came up to me and excitedly said, "Mrs. Faith, I did it." I asked the child if he had ever done that before. His response was no, his mom or grandma always did it for him. He was so excited that he was able to open his drink, that I failed to recognize the importance of this accomplishment for him.

I think sometimes, we as parents, myself included, do so much for our kids because it's just easier to do it ourselves, than the train them to do something. I know, I'd rather clean something because I know it would be done to my standards than to teach my child how to do something. But in doing so, we are failing our kids. I believe we are handicapping our kids by doing everything for them.

You might think your child is young, but your child can do more than you think. Am I going to act like I can do something when someone will do it for me? Absolutely not. Same with a child. Can an infant dress themselves? Nope,

but a 2 or 3 year old can with some help. Can your toddler vacuum? No, but they can put their toys away so you can vacuum. Can your 4 or 5 year old cook dinner? Probably not, but they can help clear the table after dinner. Can your 6 or 7 year old do laundry? No, but they can sort the laundry. You get the picture.

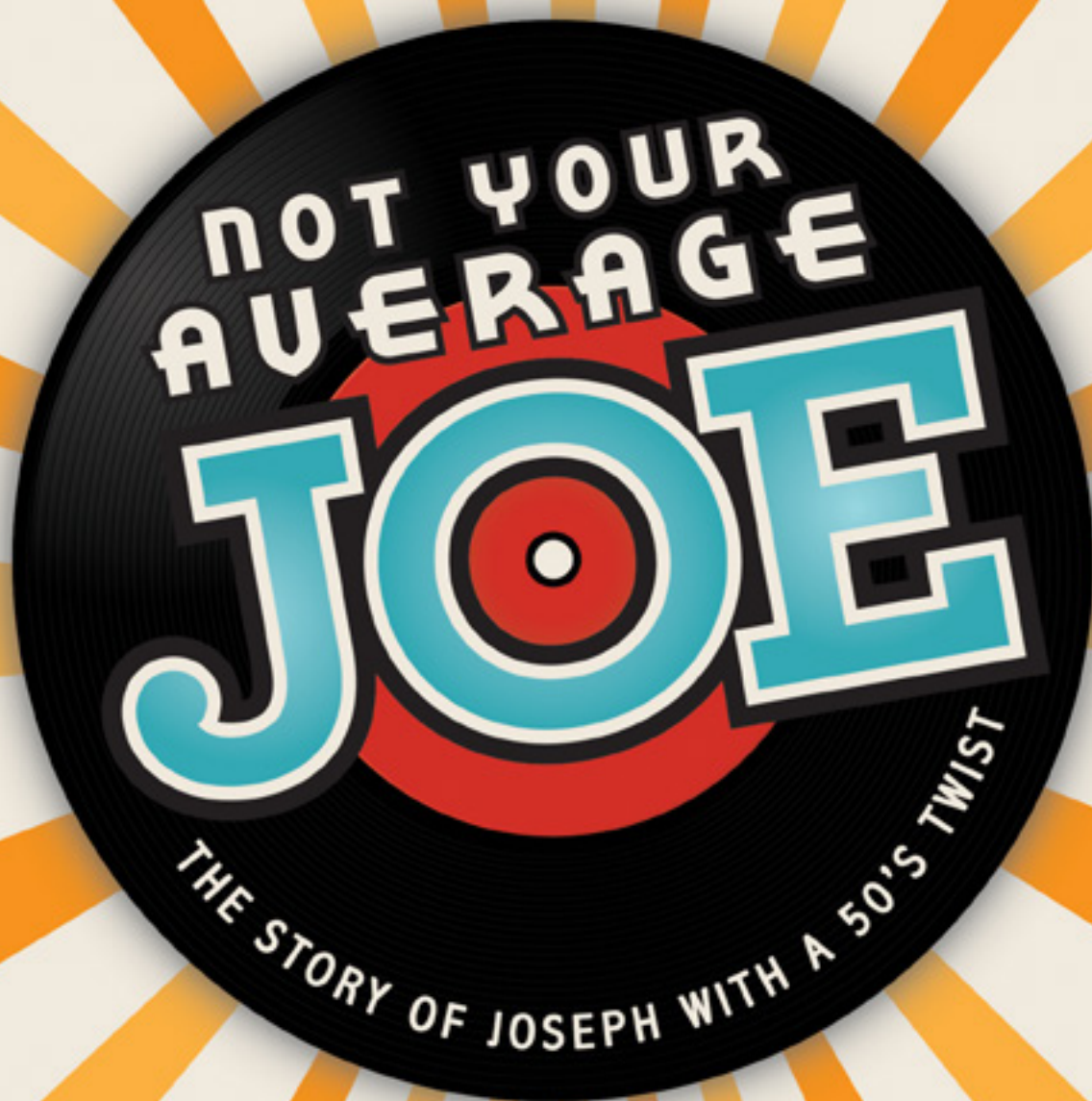
I know parents receive all sorts of conflicting information from all sides telling them to let the children be little, and I think that has spilled over into the area of basic skills, etc. Parents, we need to be constantly teaching our kids for the next step/phase of life. I think we are so busy allowing our children to be little that we fail to realize they can do big things. They can be our helpers. Will it take longer? Sure. However, will it help their self confidence and help them be an active participant in the family? Absolutely.

I believe there are some faith based reasons for teaching our children to do "big things." As Christians, we are called to serve one another. What better way than to teach them how to serve the family of God, then to teach them to serve their family first? Should we treat our children like the Disney princess, Cinderella? Of course not, but they need learn to be a part of a team. Even God gave chores to Adam. Genesis 2:15, "The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it." God teaches against laziness, etc. Part of the ways we can teach our

children discipline in the area of life, begins as we teach them to do things on their own and for their family.

Never has this been more in my face than this past year. As Lauren gets ready to leave for college in August, I am constantly questioning myself on if I taught her this or that. She was leaving the house just last night to drive to go to the movies and I had the thought, if she gets pulled over by a cop for speeding, will she know what a car registration is when they ask for it? Something so insignificant, and I'm praying she won't have to do that ever, but what if? Have I taught her what she needs to know to be a thriving member of society and a good roommate at college?

Parents, oh, let your children be little, but let them help you. You want to be the one to teach them how to do 'this or that'. You don't want them calling you from college asking them how to wash their clothes. Our kids can do more than you think. Teach them for the next step. Praise them often. Watch them grow into what God made them to be. Teach them to serve the family at home, so that prayerfully, one day, they will serve their family at home and at church. Don't let them fool you to think they can't do things because they are young, because our children can do "big things." 🍀

THE RISE OF THE *INFLUENCER*

A lot can happen in ten years. Believe it or not, you can pack what seems like an entire lifetime into a decade. In a ten year span of time, your six year old will start driving, and your sixteen year old will get married. In a single decade, a twenty six year old will have kids and make their parents grandparents. The thirty six year old will be over the hill and experience their midlife crisis. The 46 year old will become a first time grandparent and a 56 year old will retire over the course of the next ten years. The 66 year old man will (hopefully) surpass the average life expectancy of a male in the United States, and the 76 year old woman will (again hopefully) surpass the average life expectancy for females in the United States. Those fortunate enough to live from 86 to 96 will have outlived 99.5% of everyone else. In the rare case someone lives to 105, they will have lived in two centuries, said goodbye to all of their friends and many family members, become great great grandparents as they welcome new generations into their legacy, and tell stories about the olden days that seem too fantastical to be true but completely are! What's the point? A decade is a surprisingly long amount of time, but as Jesus's half brother James put it, life vanishes like a vapor. A lot can happen in ten years, and those same ten years can seem like the blink of an eye.



The same is true of society as it is of your life, but the problem is that societal changes have begun to accelerate at an exponential rate and are on the precipice of becoming completely out of control. Completely off the rails. Unhinged. With so much drastic change over the past decade, it's imperative for parents to monitor and meter an appropriate schedule of exposure to the ugly side of this world corrupted by sin.

One of the foundational shifts the last decade has seen is the rise of the “influencer.” Social media personalities that are paid to promote brands, products, and ideas through their social media accounts. Gone are the days of big polished marketing campaigns. Corporations, politicians, and special interest groups have embraced the fundamental psychology behind marketing; people trust people. When real people vouch for a brand or a product, we trust what they tell us.

A Neilson study found that 71% of consumers trust advertising, opinions, and product placement from influencers, and 64% of global marketers say it is their most effective paid channel or advertising.

This is the formula behind influencer marketing. Big-money pays regular people to push their products and ideas. People trust people, so we “buy” what they're selling. We trust the experiences of others.

But what if I told you that parents are the single most important influence in the life of a child, not social media influencers, or their friends, or teachers, or coaches. Parents. Most parents wouldn't believe it. In a Parents Empowered survey, parents placed themselves last in the line-up of influences on their children— after friends, teachers, and social media. But when youth answered the same question, they placed their parents first— before family, friends, teachers, and clubs/activities. Don't dismiss that or let its significance slip by. That's a tremendous reason for hope, especially for a Christian parent!

As a Christian parent, there are 5 simple things you can do to help your children develop a faith of their own:

1. PRAY WITH YOUR CHILDREN

Prayer is one of the most significant ways to help your children build a relationship with God. Pray with them daily, and encourage them to pray in their own time as well. Teach them to listen for God's voice and provide them with guidance on how to talk to Him.

2. READ THE BIBLE TOGETHER

Reading the Bible is vital for building a strong faith foundation. Take time to read scripture with your children and explain the meaning and teachings. Start with some of the Bible stories that are easy to understand, and as they grow older, introduce more complex passages. The Gospel of John is a great place to start.

3. ATTEND CHURCH REGULARLY

Attending church is an essential part of a Christian's life. Make sure you take your children to church every week and get them involved in the activities and events. This helps them to form relationships with other Christians and solidify their own faith.

4. TEACH THEM TO SERVE OTHERS

It's essential to teach your children to give back to the community and serve others in need. You can do this by volunteering together, or by encouraging them to join a church group that focuses on community service. Charity is at its very core a Christian principle, a natural result of the Holy Spirit in us.

5. MODEL YOUR FAITH

As a Christian parent, you are the primary role model for your children. Your actions and behaviors significantly impact their faith journey. Always strive to model your faith, values, and morals. Show them how to pray, how to read the Bible, and how to live a Christian life. And praise in your kids what you want to see repeated.

As a parent you have the opportunity to help your children develop a deep, meaningful, fulfilling relationship with God. The five actions mentioned above will provide your children with a solid foundation of faith, guidance, and love. By instilling these values in your kids, you are not only helping them, but you are also fulfilling God's calling on your life as a parent: to lead your kids to saving faith in Jesus Christ and a growing relationship with Him. Because believe it or not, a lot can happen in ten years, and you can lay an eternal foundation for your children in just a decade. So Influence your children with the level of confidence that they have in your influence. 🌿

POWER TO REDEEM

There's a line to a worship song that has been echoing in my head over the past couple weeks. "Power to Redeem" is a song Lauren Daigle released on her first album, featuring David Leonard and Leslie Jordan from the worship duo All Sons and Daughters.

The opening line of the song says, "You take what is and You make it beautiful." Each of us experience situations and seasons in life that are more difficult than others. In the midst of a not-so-great situation, we can believe and trust that God is going to take it and make it beautiful, knowing that "when love floods in, we're restored forevermore." This is a theme echoed throughout Scripture.

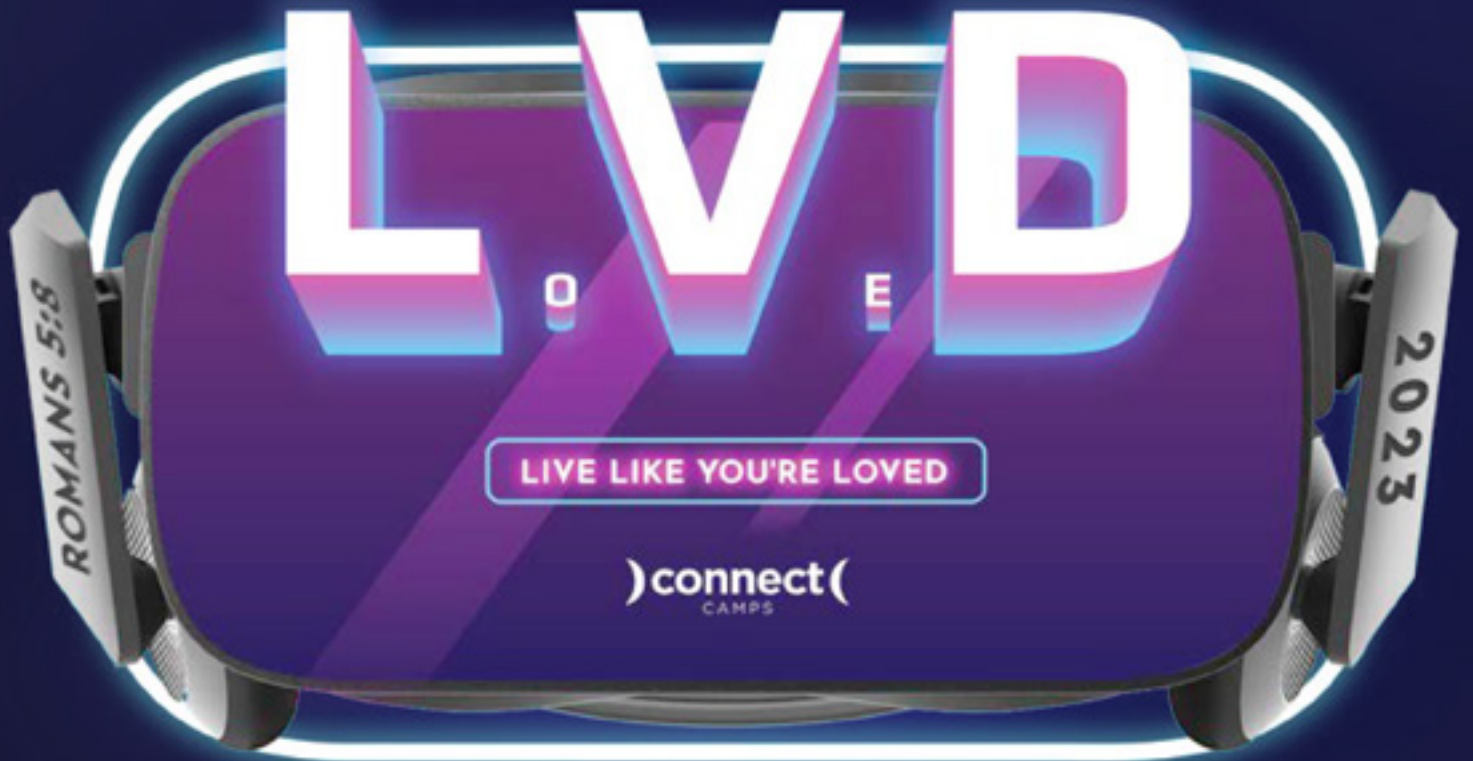

It's what He did on the cross. Such an ugly, violent, and despicable act, yet it was necessary for our salvation. God has made the cross beautiful, and something worth celebrating. Through the cross of Jesus, we find life. Through His death and burial, believers have resurrection - just as Jesus did.

The chorus of the song says, "With breath that brings the dead to life, with words that pierce the dark with Light, only by the blood are we set free. With mercy strong to carry shame and nail it to a tree, You alone hold the power to redeem." Let's stay in tune with the new things the Lord is doing in our midst each day. He's continually taking things that are dirty and seem like there is no restoration possible, and turning them to something beautiful. May we see the life and breath God is breathing into each moment, calling and redeeming all things to His Name. Let's sing out to declare in faith that God will take what is and make it beautiful. 🌿
