- B. He was extremely zealous
 - 1. Pharisee: Religious but not right with God
 - 2. Prisoner to his religion
 - 3. Personality of a narcissist
 - 4. Plethora of titles
 - 5. Persecutor of Christians
 - A. Torture
 - B. Enslave
 - C. Murder

III. Why did Saul hate Christians?

- A. He saw Christianity as a threat
- B. An insult to his religion
- C. He saw them as an enemy of the state
- D. He felt something must be done
 - 1. With determination

 - 10. He is blind, broken, on his back
 - 11. The voice declares
 - A. I am Jesus
 - B. The one you are persecuting
 - 12. Paul learns 3 things
 - A. Jesus is alive
 - B. Jesus is the one being persecuted
 - C. He is no match for the power of God
 - 13. There is a moment in your life God makes it clear who He is
