





WERD YEARS

My first year out of college, I taught sixth through twelfth graders at a Christian school. There were ages that I loved, and then there were ages that I just thought, "Man, these kids are just weird." As the years have gone by and as the world has changed, so has the ages of phases our children go through. If I had to say what the weird years were now, it would be fifth and sixth grade. These kids are fighting battles we don't know about. They face things that you and I have never had to face. I often thank God that social media wasn't around when I was making less than ideal decisions. (I'm also thankful social media wasn't around so there's no proof of bad hairstyles and clothing choices.)

During the weird preteens years, they often begin to question their identity and purpose. This is a time for parents to get in the trenches and help your children through this phase. Here are seven practical ways that you can help your preteen in finding their identity and purpose.

Encourage your preteen to reflect on their interests and strengths. Help them explore what makes them unique and special.

Make sure your preteen has positive Christian role models who

exemplify strong character and values. Your preteen should have at least five adults in their life that can help them through life. That is why we have small group leaders here on Wednesday nights to pour into the life of your children.

Create a safe and open environment for your preteen to express their thoughts, questions, and concerns. Listen to them, validate their feelings, and provide guidance when needed. My dad once told me that when something big or bad happened with Lauren, that I needed to make sure my response was appropriate. I needed to make sure that when it was most important, she knew that we were a safe space to talk to, and that we would be there for her. I would lose my mind if she couldn't find her shoes for church on a Sunday morning, but when it really mattered, I even surprised myself in my response. Because we handled that situation with Lauren appropriately, she now knows she can come to us at anytime and we are her safe space.

Engage in discussions about faith and a relationship with Jesus. Encourage them to ask questions and for them to seek understanding.

Attend church services, and do Bible study together as a family.

Encourage your preteen to participate in activities that align with their interests and values. Be mindful of these activities taking precedence and priority over Jesus.

Remind your preteen that their worth and identity is rooted in God's unconditional love. Help them understand, and remind them daily that they are fearfully and wonderfully made. Psalm 139:14, "I will praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well."

Last but not least, parents, please provide guidance on media consumption. Discuss the influence that media has on identity formation. Help your preteen make wise choices about the books, movies, music, and the social media they engage with. If I could throw out one thing as a parent of an 18, almost 19 year old, it would be to make them put the phone down and have face to face conversations with others.

Oh parents, this is a tough age. Do you remember how those years were for you? I was not a model child during this age. Truth be told, I'm surprised I'm still living after those years. Jesus saved my life, because I'm surprised my didn't momma slap the life out of me!

Isaiah 41:10, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." This season of parenting can be tough, however, I know God has a purpose and a plan for the preteens of Live Oak Church. I also know He will teach you a lot about yourself through these years, and a lot about your children. I am praying Isaiah 41:10 over you as you are in the preteen trenches. *Ø*

Last month, we introduced the song "Bless God" by Brooke Ligertwood (co-written by Brandon Lake and Cody Carnes). This song challenges us to focus our hearts on blessing God at all times and in all seasons. Even when times are difficult or uncertain, we should look to find the places where God is moving and working in our lives.

During Sunday services, I often read from Psalm 34:1-3: "I will bless the Lord at all times, His praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul makes its boast in the Lord, let the humble hear and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, let us exalt His name together." It's a great passage and reminder for us to worship the Lord together. The Psalm goes on to declare: "the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their cry" (v. 15), and "the Lord is near to the broken-hearted, and saves the crushed in spirit" (v. 18). What an incredible promise of God's provision and grace that sustains us, and gives us life.

When we experience the nearness of God in the middle of our brokenness, or we see Him respond to our cry, our only response is one of worship!

Worship isn't merely songs or music. Worship is a life surrendered in full obedience to God's will.

As Paul writes, we "offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your true and proper worship" (Romans 12:1). Worship is giving our hearts affection to Him because of His great love and surpassing kindness for us - that meets us where we are, that changes us, and gives us hope and a future in Him.

Jesus is the firstborn over all creation. The One who emptied Himself, took on human flesh - who bore our sin on Himself, and defeated sin, death and the grave. He is the risen and reigning Lamb who sits upon the throne. How can we *not* worship? When we experience the presence of God, our hearts can't help but worship Him fully. It's surrendering our whole life to the Lord, being "all in" as Dr. Mark taught a few weeks ago. All in for Christ - whether we're in the sanctuary or the darkest valley, the fields of plenty or when our hands are empty.

When we understand our life is in Christ alone, we then look for opportunities to lift our hearts and voices in worship. With a clearer picture of God's love, we can then "sing if you've known His grace" and "sing if you love His name" because we've experienced His love. We recognize Christ alone is "worthy of all our praise." May we bless God and praise His name - even when no one is watching, even when the days are difficult - even when our worship is costly! God is always worthy of our worship and worthy of our hearts fully surrendered to Him. May our prayer be: "every chance I get, I'll bless Your Name."
