 1. 34 books of the Bible
 2. From Genesis to Revelation
 - B. They operate in the spiritual and physical realm

 1. Names
 - D. Can be seen in some instances
 - E. Powerful

- IV. **What do they do?**
 - A. In relation to God
 1. Praise, worship, give glory to God
 2. Messengers
 - B. In relation to Jesus
 1. At His birth
 - a. Predicted
 - b. Pronounced
 - c. Protected
 2. After His temptation
 3. Strengthen Him at Gethsemane
 4. Rolled away the stone at resurrection
 5. Announced His resurrection
 6. Declared His return

 - b. Encourage in times of danger
