365 New Days, 365 New Chances

In my office, I have a sign that reads, “365 New Days, 365 New Chances.” I’m pretty sure whoever made it was aiming for a little inspirational desk décor, not to personally call us out, but here we are.

Let’s be real for a moment. January shows up, and we all have big plans. Our family will sit around the table for dinner. We will be kinder to each other. We will not be so busy. Then January 12 arrives, and somehow we are right back where we were at the end of last year.

Here is the thing, though. The new year is not about becoming a whole new family. It is about being more intentional with the beautifully imperfect one God already gave you. If I could challenge the families of Live Oak Church to be intentional in just one area this year, it would be this. Develop habits of faith.

Faith habits do not usually start with grand gestures. They start small. Sometimes awkwardly. A prayer in the car before school that feels rushed. A quick Bible verse at bedtime when everyone is half asleep. A moment when you choose grace instead of losing your mind. Yes, Mom and Dad, even that one counts as spiritual growth.

Deuteronomy 6 reminds us that faith is meant to be woven into everyday life. When we sit at home. When we walk along the road. When we lie down. When

we get up. In other words, faith formation is not another item to add to your to do list. It is about inviting God into what you are already doing.

The new year gives us a chance, not to aim for perfection, but to aim for presence. To pause and ask, what is one small habit we can build that points our family back to Jesus. One prayer. One conversation. One intentional moment at a time.

And here is the good news. God is not waiting for you to do this flawlessly. Lamentations 3:22 to 23 tells us His mercies are new every morning. Not every January. Every single morning.

So if yesterday was chaos, great. Today is a new chance. If last year felt like survival mode, God still showed up. And if you start strong and fizzle out by February, that is just being human. God’s grace does not expire.

365 new days. 365 new chances. Not to be perfect parents, but to faithfully point our kids, again and again, to a perfect Savior who walks with us through it all. 🌱



A New Understanding of Worship in the New Year

As we start a new year, we often focus on specific areas - losing weight, getting out of debt, or finally starting that dream project. The shift in mindset is a perfect opportunity to reassess our spiritual lives as well. When we look at our worship, how can we draw closer to the heart of God this year? The way we understand worship itself can help shape what next steps we take.

In the Old Testament, the Levites were commissioned by God as a tribe of priests, judges, gatekeepers, craftsmen, singers, and musicians. These weren't entertainers; they were ministers, who led people to honor God through sacrificial worship. The focus was never to be on the tools - the songs, music, instruments, or leaders. Over time, leaders shifted away from a pastoral role in worship toward a more music-centric, performance-based model. This lasted for hundreds of years, and is unfortunately still present in some churches today. With the Reformation, the Church shifted back toward biblical worship leadership, as songs returned to the language of the people, and were now set to familiar melodies. This allowed the people of God to participate and sing along once again as God had always desired. This was a return to the heart of worship - the exaltation of Jesus Christ. Worship was never to be focused on music or melodies; worship is about Jesus.

One worship leader (Michael Boggs) says,

"Church, we do not sing because we need a 'warm-up' before the sermon. We don't sing so people have time to get to their seats. We do not sing because we need to be entertained. We sing because God is good. We sing because God is worthy. We sing because it's a communal act of unity in which we declare the glory of God, the gravity of sin, and the grandeur of grace!"

When we understand worship this way, we see it as more than just music and singing. Sure, singing is an important piece, and something Scripture commands us to do regularly. Worship though, is defined as ascribing worth to someone or something of significant value. For the Christian, our highest worth is God. Christian worship is a longing to know God, to interact with Him, and to make His will first in our lives. It's a desire for relationship. Just as our connection with a spouse grows the closer we are in relationship with one another, when we walk closer in relationship with God, the deeper our worship of Him grows.

"Worship, as it is described so vividly in Scripture, was meant to be a dialogue, flowing from the outpouring of a relationship with God... It is a two-way communication between God and His people. We exalt God. He reveals His presence and changes our hearts. We pour out our hearts and remember His greatness... He meets our needs for intimacy and grace" (Joe Horness). When we see worship as a rich

expression of a growing relationship with our Savior, we place the highest value on it. Our identity and the center of our focus in life should be rooted in our relationship with Christ. Everything else falls into place from there. With God first, His will for our lives takes center stage, as all other distractions begin to fade away.

When we see God as the only one worthy of our worship, we desire to surrender our entire lives to Him as an act of worship. This is what Paul means in Romans 12:1 when he says, "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God. This is your spiritual worship." The prophet Amos makes it clear that we can worship in a way that is inauthentic, declaring this actually burdens God's heart (Amos 5:21-23).

As we reassess our understanding of worship, let's consider the following questions: Are we coming to church to join a community of believers in singing, fellowship, learning, and serving (Col. 3:16; 1 Pt. 4:10)? Are we worshiping God during the week, outside of church services (Ps. 35:18)? Do people see the "joy of our salvation" (Ps. 51:12) in the way we live and prioritize our schedules? Lord, help us see your heart in worship. May we move beyond defining worship as an 18 minute block of music once a week. Let's begin this new year daily worshiping in pursuit of the living God! 🌱

EVANGELISM AND APOLOGETICS? A Call for Every Believer

Have you ever wondered what it really means to share your faith? Maybe you've heard the word "evangelism" before and thought it was only for preachers or missionaries. Or maybe the word "apologetics" sounds like something reserved for scholars or pastors with degrees. But here's a truth we often miss in our everyday walk with God: evangelism and apologetics are not just for the gifted few. They are for all of us who call Jesus Lord.

So let's start with evangelism. What is it? At its simplest, evangelism is telling others the good news of Jesus Christ. The word comes from the Greek word "euangelion," which means "good news." And this good news is the message that God loves the world so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to die for our sins and rise again, offering eternal life to anyone who believes in Him. Evangelism is not a performance or a debate. It is not about having perfect words or answering every question. It is about being faithful to tell people about the hope we have in Jesus. It's about opening our mouths and sharing what God has done in our lives. Evangelism happens in all kinds of ways. Sometimes it's a quiet conversation with a friend over coffee. Other times it's through serving someone in need, being ready to explain why we care. It can be as simple as inviting someone to church or offering to pray with a co-worker going through a hard time. Whether we feel naturally bold or not, we are all given the same mission: go and make disciples. That mission wasn't given just to the apostles or church leaders. It was given to every follower of Christ. That includes you and me.

Now let's talk about apologetics. No, this doesn't mean apologizing for being a Christian. In fact, it's quite the opposite. Apologetics comes from the Greek word "apologia," which means "a defense."

Christian apologetics is about giving a reasoned explanation for the hope we have. It's answering tough questions with truth and grace. Peter writes in 1 Peter 3:15, "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." That's the heart of apologetics. It's not about winning arguments. It's about helping people remove barriers to faith. Imagine someone saying, "How can you believe in God when there's so much suffering?" or "Isn't the Bible just a book written by men?" or "Why should I believe Jesus is the only way?" These are real questions, and they deserve thoughtful responses. Apologetics is how we lovingly and patiently walk with people through those doubts and lead them toward the truth.

But here's the good news. You don't need to be a theology professor or a public speaker to be an apologist. You just need to care enough to learn and be willing to speak. Start small. Learn a few clear reasons why you believe God exists. Understand the core of the gospel message. Be honest when you don't know an answer and follow up with kindness. You're not trying to impress anyone. You're trying to reflect Jesus.

Now you might be wondering, "But what if I'm not good at talking to people?" or "I get nervous sharing my faith." That's okay. God equips those He calls. And He has called all of us. Evangelism and apologetics are not about personality. They're about obedience and love. When you love someone, you want them to know Jesus. And when you love the truth, you want to defend it in a way that draws people closer, not pushes them away.

Let's make this fun and real for everyone. Kids, how can you tell a friend about Jesus at school? Maybe you can draw a picture of the cross and explain what it means. Maybe you can be kind when someone is being left out and tell them Jesus loves them. Teens, what if someone at school says they don't believe in God? Can you share your own story of how God has helped you through hard times? Parents, how can you model these conversations at home? Do your kids hear you pray for your neighbors or talk about your faith at the dinner table? Seniors, can you share your faith journey with a younger generation and encourage them with wisdom from years of walking with the Lord?

We are a body, and each part plays a role. Some may be gifted as evangelists, naturally able to lead people to Christ with confidence and passion. Others may have minds shaped for deep thinking and find joy in defending the faith. But all of us, every believer, is called to be a witness. That means we speak when the opportunity comes. We love with boldness. We live with purpose.

So here's the challenge. This month, ask God for one opportunity to share your faith. Just one. It might be with a neighbor, a friend, a stranger, or a family member. Ask God to help you listen well, speak gently, and trust Him with the results. You don't have to be perfect. You just have to be willing.

Let's be a church where every person, from the youngest to the oldest, knows they are called to share the good news and stand firm in the truth. Let's encourage one another, learn together, and take small steps of faith that add up to big things in the Kingdom of God. 🌱

A DROP FROM THE ALTAR by Sam LoBello


