#### We All Want To Be Known For Something

- I. What were you known for? What do you want to be known for?
  - A. A good parent
  - B. A good sales rep.
  - C. An amazing teacher, physician, attorney, law enforcement, etc.
- II. Zacchaeus was known for:
  - A. Being short (small stature)
    - 1. Bullied
    - 2. Overlooked
    - 3. Not taken seriously
  - B. When you are known for something, you don't want to be known for Or, when we don't measure up to our "image"
    - 1. We start making excuses
    - 2. We start pretending
    - 3. We start overcompensating
  - C. Zacchaeus (overcompensated)
    - 1. Became chief tax collector
    - 2. He cheated, extorted, abused his people
    - 3. He taught others how to do the same
  - D. He was rich, but hated
    - 1. Lonely
    - 2. Avoided
    - 3. Insecure
    - 4. He had spent his life hiding his insecurities
    - 5. He tried to cover-up his imperfections, feelings
    - 6. That is stressful, exhausting, robs you of your peace
  - E. Zacchaeus was struggling with what he wanted to be known for, and who he actually was
    - 1. Wanted to be known for being successful and rich
    - 2. Known as a cheat, con, traitor, extortioner
    - 3. Everyone hated him
- III. Like most tax collectors, Zacchaeus stayed guarded
  - A. He had "walls" up
  - B. He pretended a lot
  - C. He finally realized
    - 1. You don't get better until you get authentic
    - 2. Until we embrace where we are, we can't get where we want to be
    - 3. If you stay guarded, you won't relate to people and they won't relate to you

#### IV. When Jesus showed up, Zacchaeus let his guard down

- A. He believed Jesus could make a difference
- B. Zacchaeus was realizing some things
  - 1. Money is a master/idol that is never satisfied
  - 2. His position and pride were not giving him what he wanted
  - 3. His secret life, sins, loneliness was destroying him

#### V. Zacchaeus was willing to do something unusual - climb a tree to see a Rabbi

- A. He became vulnerable, transparent, real
- B. When you bring your life into the light, healing begins
- C. When was last time you were transparent about:
  - 1. A fear
  - 2. A fetish
  - 3. A family problem

#### VI. This is why Jesus called Zacchaeus by name

  - 1. Fellowship/community is essential
