The Great Riddle Of Exodus 34:6

I. What the cross of Jesus was designed to do

- A. To bring life out of death
 - 1. Jesus' death would give us life
 - 2. He rescues us, paying our debt
- B. To bring grace out of wrath
 - 1. As God pours out His wrath on Jesus
 - 2. He pours out His grace on us
- C. To bring light out of darkness
 - 1. The land went dark
 - 2. The darkness of humanity at its worse
 - 3. So the light of God would shine and be seen in us
- D. To bring triumph out of tragedy
 - 1. Our lives are tragic, they end in death
 - 2. The wages of sin is death
- E. The cross brings adoption out of judgment

II. How does God accomplish this?

- A. Sends His only begotten Son to be scorned and sacrificed
 - 1. He came to take our place
 - 2. He came to pay the debt of our sin
 - 3. We don't understand the depth of our sin
 - a. We suppress it
 - b. We deny it
 - c. We transfer it
 - d. We excuse it
 - e. We minimize it
 - f. We defend it
 - g. We make it our identity
 - 4. But when you see it for what it is that it destroys you and keeps you from God you recognize the importance of a savior
 - 5. Jesus came doing miracles proving His deity and was mocked and rejected
- B. God sent His Son to be our substitute
 - 1. Our grief and sin he bore
 - 2. He was pierced, crushed, mocked for our iniquities
 - 3. He who knew no sin became sin

- C. God's Son was sent to submit
 - 1. He did not defend Himself
 - 2. The sacrificial lamb
 - 3. He was judged, oppressed and killed
 - 4. To be thrown into the city dump
 - 5. With a rich man at His death
- D. God was satisfied
 - 1. It is finished
 - 2. The crucifixion was an achievement
 - 3. He made a way, he built a bridge
 - 4. He gives the hope, forgiveness and grace we need
 - 5. All who turn to Him have eternal life
