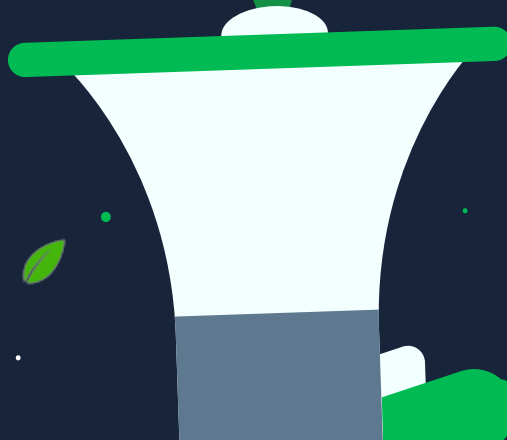

LOST YOUR MARBLERES

I'm sure throughout all the conversations you've had in life, you've heard the phrase "lost your marbles" once or twice along the way. "Lost my marbles" is a phrase that dates back to the mid-1800s. Over the years, this phrase has gone through many different definitions. While looking up this term, I've found that it means "to go insane, to lose one's mind, or to become angry." Well let me tell you, parenting is not for the faint of heart, and if you've been a parent for any length of time, I'm sure you felt like you've lost your marbles once or twice along the way.

I don't know if you've ever heard of the legacy marble bag, but if you've been around Live Oak Church and have a child, you probably have. If you don't know what I'm talking about, Legacy Marbles are a physical representation of how much time you have with your child. The day your child is born, you have 936 weeks until your child turns 18. Each week that passes, you lose one marble. The whole hope behind the legacy marbles is for parents to see how much time they have left in hopes that they will "seize the day" and do more with the time they have with their children.

As I was thinking about time spent with children, I looked up what others had written about parenting and ways to NOT lose their marbles. Some of them are just downright hilarious, while others, I just have to shake my head at. Apparently in order to NOT lose your marbles, you should: eat your cookies in the bathroom, keep your makeup in the kitchen, wine, ditch the multitasking, ask yourself if it will matter in five years and don't be "that mom" (the one that says "I'd never do that"). Clearly the best advice in that article was to eat your cookies in the bathroom.

At the time that I am writing this, I have approximately 3 more marbles until my daughter, Lauren, turns 18. I clearly am not ready for that, but what I have learned over the years is that I "lost my marbles" quickly.

Moms and Dads, I know you are in the thick of parenting, and some of you think that eighteen years is so far away and that you have plenty of time, but let me break it to you nicely, you don't. I never understood how true the phrase "the days are long, but the years are short" was until a few years ago.

If I could think of verses to help parents to "seize the day", the following two verses come to mind. "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Psalm 90:12 and "Making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." Ephesians 5:16

Traveling is very important to me and my husband, Chris. Some of the best times that I have ever had with Lauren were on vacation. Whether it was watching bubbles fly from the top deck of a cruise with Lauren when she was three, or deciding to do this thing called "glamping" in the desert, these are the moments I remember. These are not extraordinary adventures, but more simple things. These are the times I love to spend with Lauren and away from the hustle and bustle of life. I remember talking with Lauren when I booked camping in the desert. I asked her what she thought about doing that. She told me, "well it will either be a good or bad, but it will be memories."

My quiet Lauren is always up for an adventure when traveling because she loves making memories. The places are amazing, but what I love most are the conversations that take place when we are hiking up a mountain, or riding in a car. I love to see her dad taking the time to show Lauren how to look through a scope to find the animal in the mountains. I want Lauren to know that we love spending time with her. We want her to know that she matters to us.

I want Lauren to know that she can come and talk to us about the big and little things and that mom and dad are her safe space. I want her to talk to us about what's going on in life and be able to point her to what her heavenly Father says about certain topics in order to help her navigate this thing called life. I'm pretty sure if you are reading this, you do too.

Parents, time is precious, and we aren't promised tomorrow. If I could give you any piece of advice from someone who didn't "seize the day" as much as I could have as a parent, it would be to ask yourself what you want your child to remember about their childhood. Did you spend your time with them wisely? Did you invest in your child's spiritual health? Did you teach your child who God is? Did you pray together as a family? Did you teach your child to turn to the Bible when they have questions? Did you spend time together doing meaningful things, or were you just so busy that you didn't take the time to "stop and smell the roses." Did you respond in a manner when your child messed up big time, that they knew that mom and dad still loved them? Did you make memories with your child? Did you go on vacation together? Did you laugh? Did you show your children that life is fun? Above all, did you point your child to their heavenly Father.

I know the days are long. Trust me, some of them are *really* long. However, the years are really short. If I could challenge you as a parent, it would be to make the most of every moment and be intentional, because before you know it, you'll have lost all your marbles. 🌿



AT ALL TIMES & IN ALL SEASONS

Last month, we looked at the topic of joy in worship. We often associate worship more with joyful, celebratory times where we're thankful for what God has done. We generally don't idealize the difficult times in worship when we're struggling, crying out, and desperate for His presence. Yet we are called to approach God in worship at all times with a sense of holy expectancy - expecting His love to radically change our lives for His glory. This type of worship is often referred to in Scripture as "waiting on the Lord" (Isa. 40; Psa. 27).

Both joy and lament are critical to a lifestyle to worship because they provide a clearer picture of our heart for the Lord. Our heart isn't always rainbows and butterflies. As Christine Caine has said, "In our worship, we need a margin for lament." The words "lament" or "mourn" aren't ones we use often, but a lament is a "passionate expression of grief or sorrow." You see, it's okay to not always feel hopeful, joyful, or like we have our lives all together. What's important is where we turn in those low moments of life.

David Crowder has said, "Every second is an opportunity for praise. There's a choosing to be made. A choosing at each moment." When we make the choice to worship in spite of our circumstances, it puts God in a clear view and helps us to see our situation and our world through God's eyes rather than just the lens of our present difficulty, and the fear that goes

along with it. Our window is only so big; God's perspective is so much bigger and so much clearer of what's going on, what's coming next, and how to navigate through this.

We often want to see things happen at our pace, but sometimes life takes a little longer than we'd like. Sometimes God's plan unfolding takes a little longer as well. Growing up, my pastor often said "Growth doesn't happen on the mountaintop; growth happens in the valley." If we can reframe our difficult seasons and low valleys as an opportunity for growth, it will change our perspective. We'll begin to see what God wants to do in us, through us, and around us in this season in our lives as we focus our hearts on Him. "Sometimes praise is repetitively desperate, but it's often in these repetitious cries that purer praise is found" (David Crowder).

In the book of Lamentations, the prophet Jeremiah writes about the Israelites mourning the destruction of Jerusalem. King Nebuchadnezzar had laid the city to waste, killed thousands of people, and destroyed the temple of God. People didn't have anything to eat or drink, and enemies were seeking all kinds of harm for the Israelites. It was an incredibly dark and difficult time. In the middle of this lament, Jeremiah reminds the Israelites of this truth of God's nature: "the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases. His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning. Great is

Your faithfulness. The Lord is my portion, says my soul, therefore I will hope in Him. The Lord is good to those who wait for Him, for the soul that seeks Him. It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord" (Lam. 3:22-26).

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases! No matter how dark the situation may seem, our God is brighter. Regardless of how big the giant we're facing may seem, our God is bigger (just ask David about Goliath). Jeremiah reminds us that the Lord is our portion, His mercies are new everyday, so we can and should place our hope in Him alone.

In Isaiah 30:15, the Lord says, "In repentance and rest is your salvation; in quietness and trust is your strength." Our calling as believers is to worship the Lord at all times, and in all seasons. Worship Him now, later today, tonight, and again tomorrow morning. In all circumstances, hope, wait, and seek the Lord. Lay your heart before Him, asking for greater trust, patience, and reliance on Him.

Rest in the faithfulness of the Lord today, and begin to see how He is working in your midst to draw hearts closer to Him - your heart and the hearts of not-yet-believers around you. May we lay our fears and our sins before our Savior and worship in the renewal and strength He provides new every morning. 🍀

You are formally invited to become a member of Live Oak Church. Join today!

On October 30, 2022, the members of Live Oak United Methodist Church voted by a 99% margin to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Conference. Subsequently, the Louisiana Annual Conference of the UMC formally affirmed the church's disaffiliation.

As of January 1, 2023, the organization formerly known as *Live Oak United Methodist Church* became *Live Oak Church*. Since this is a new organization, everyone has the opportunity to become a member of this brand-new church. The process for someone wishing to join Live Oak Church will remain the same, with candidates for membership completing a four-session class before membership is conferred. However, each person receiving this letter was a Live Oak United Methodist Church member, and eligible for a "transfer of membership."

For a limited time only, you can "transfer" your membership to Live Oak Church by affirming and signing the Live Oak Church Statement of Faith and professing your faith in Jesus Christ.

To help with our record-keeping, this period of "membership transfer" will be open until April 9, 2023. Once this window closes, those wishing to join Live Oak Church will be required to complete our New Members Class.

To "transfer" your membership, we simply ask that you pray, read the Live Oak Church Statement of Faith (included in this envelope) in its entirety, complete the information form included with this letter, and return it to the church office via one of the following options:

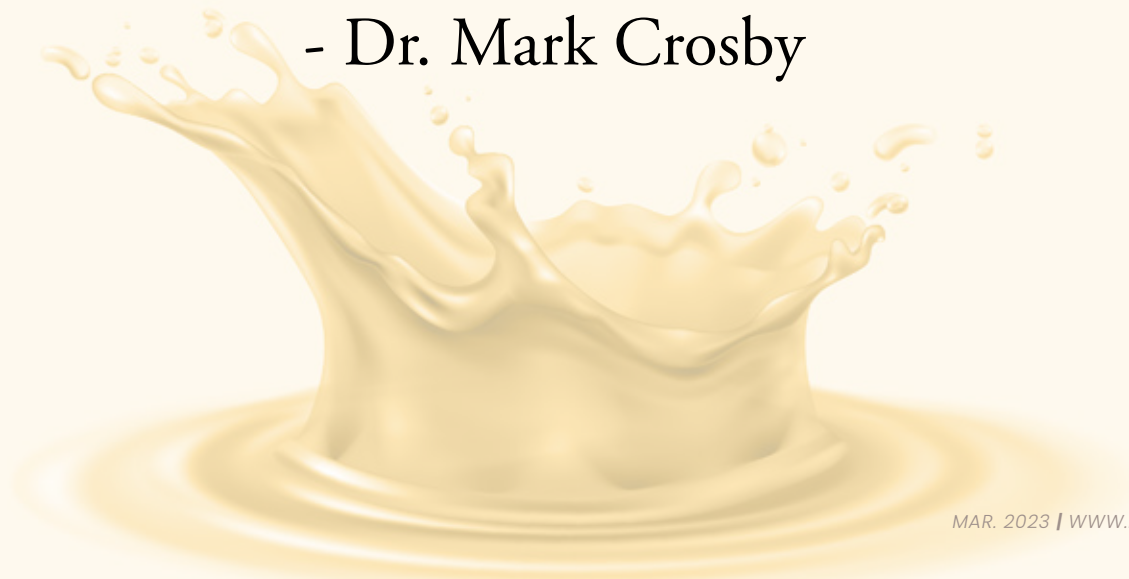
A DROP FROM THE ALTAR by sam lobello

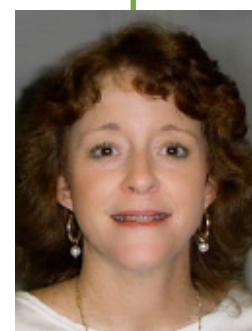

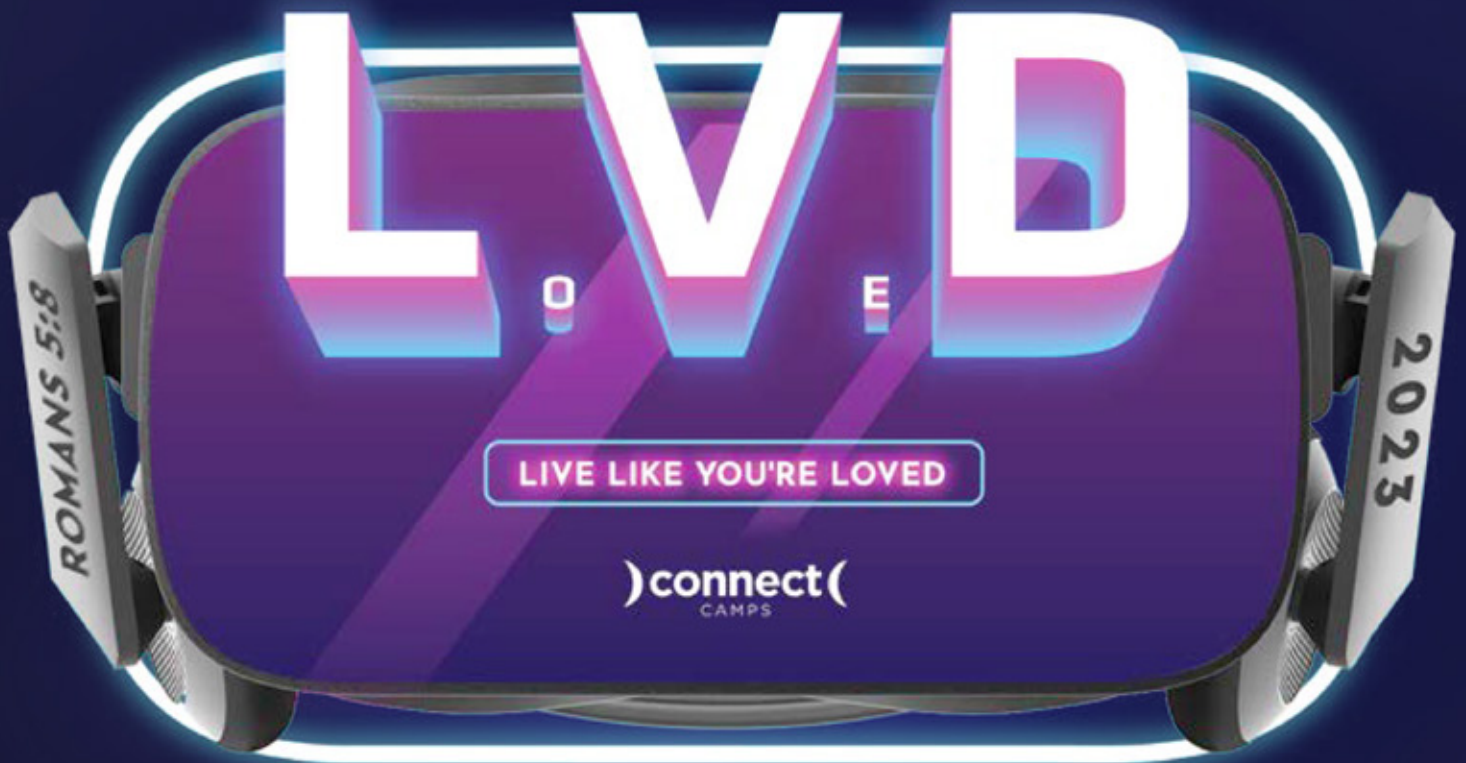
